PI Name	Kim, Sun Young
Project Overview	This research aims to improve understanding of gliomas, including glioblastoma, one of the most aggressive forms of brain cancer. Researchers will identify and study genetic and molecular markers that may help predict how these tumors develop, progress, and respond to treatment. Using a combination of computational analysis and laboratory studies, the project will evaluate the role of key genes involved in tumor growth and validate their biological significance. The long-term goal is to support earlier identification of high-risk tumors and advance the development of more personalized treatment strategies for patients with brain cancer.

Project Overview	This project supports the Comprehensive Alcohol Research Center by studying how alcohol use, diet, and HIV infection interact to affect overall health. Researchers will use a well-established nonhuman primate model of HIV infection to investigate how chronic alcohol consumption and a high-fat, high-sugar diet influence immune function, metabolism, gut health, and cognitive function. The study will also evaluate whether metformin, a commonly used diabetes medication, can reduce inflammation and improve health outcomes. The goal is to better understand the biological mechanisms underlying HIV-associated complications and identify potential strategies to improve the long-term health of individuals living with HIV.
